Although the class will be conducted in English and will therefore include all four of the basic language skills, the focus will be on reading.

(4)授業の概要	This class aims to help students improve their reading ability by focusing on the purposes and characteristics of various text types. Students will have weekly reading assignments and will be evaluated based on their ability to discuss the content and ask/answer questions. Reading material will include both fiction and non-fiction selections, for example, informational texts, poems/songs, speeches, letters/diary entries, short stories, dramas, etc. A final mini-presentation assignment will provide students with an opportunity to evaluate a text of their choice. There will be a final exam.
