Students will develop interpersonal skills alongside language skills, especially in the areas of speaking and listening, and language systems including grammar, vocabulary and phonology. In other words, through practice and feedback students by the end of the course will find themselves able to communicate more willingly, more confidently and more effectively.

授業の概要	In this course, students will be tasked with the design and delivery of presentations on five abstract topics. Working in groups, students will agree on a specific focus, normally framed as an argument, and make a presentation based on collaborative research. The result should be informative, interesting and demonstrate evidence of logical and critical thinking. Individual performances will be evaluated according to set criteria. Students will evaluate the performances of other students as well as their own. By the end of the course, students will have developed knowledge and skills in eleven areas: (1) English language skills; (2) English language systems; (3) collaborative enquiry-based research; (4) subject knowledge; (5) presentation design; (6) presentation skills; (7) interpersonal skills; (8) logical thinking; (9) critical thinking; (10) reflective thinking; and, (11) self and peer evaluation.

成績評価の方法	Presentations will be worth a total of 30%, the mid semester exam, 30%, and the end of semester exam, 40%.
成績評価の基準	Grading is based on two considerations: (1) the level of participation in groupwork and (2) presentation performance as measured against scores across evaluation criteria. Where participation in groupwork is consistently very high through the course and all presentation performances achieve maximum scores across all evaluation criteria, they will be rated Outstanding. Where participation in groupwork is consistently high through the course and most presentation performances achieve consistently high scores across all evaluation criteria, they will be rated Significantly above average. Where participation in groupwork is mostly high through the course and presentation performances achieve less than high scores across all evaluation criteria, they will be rated Slightly Above Average. Where participation in groupwork is less than high through the course and presentation performances achieve low scores across all evaluation criteria, they will be rated Meets Standards.
